The Abilities First School has over 100 students, ages 5-21 years old, from 22 school districts throughout Dutchess, Orange, Greene, Putnam and Ulster Counties. The Abilities First School,



located in LaGrange, N.Y., includes 9 classrooms equipped with instructional technology, adaptive physical education space, and clinical space for therapies. Additional classrooms are hosted within the Red Hook School District.

The Abilities First School has been providing educational and therapeutic services for over 50 years to students that have one or more of the following disabilities and are, therefore, unable to attend public school: cerebral palsy; ADHD; seizure disorders; autism spectrum disorders; developmental delays; hearing, vision or sensory impairments; genetic, neurological, chromosomal, or progressive disorders; and behavioral intervention requirements. Additionally, some of the students require nursing services to monitor their daily needs.

Founded in 1962, Abilities First is a not-for-profit organization serving the needs of the community, as well as those with developmental disabilities, from pre-school through adulthood.
