Page, Jr. to individuals with disabilities, Abilities First has renamed the annual Business of the Year Award to the Henry G. Page, Jr. Business Partnership Award. Henry G. Page, Jr., business owner and life-long member of the region passed away in February 2018 at the age of eighty-one. Mr. Page was a pioneer in business and in life, and that included the kindness, acceptance and support of opportunity to adults seeking employment or vocational experience, as well as to the youngest of individuals, to whom he extended a compassionate interest in. The award is presented annually to recognize a business for their outstanding dedication, interest and support in providing job opportunities and being a friend to our neighbors with disabilities.

The first Henry G. Page, Jr. Business Partnership Award will be presented to Adams Fairacre Farms at the annual Abilities First Community Partnership Breakfast to be held, Monday, July 16<sup>th</sup> at The Links at Union Vale in LaGrangeville, NY. Adams Fairacre Farms is being recognized for providing vocational opportunities through employment and training of individuals with disabilities.
